### **Appalachian Christmas Outreach**

The Appalachian Coalfields Ministry, sponsored by Baptists on Mission (NCBM), seeks to meet physical and spiritual needs of people living in the Appalachian Area. Working with scores of ministry centers and small churches in five Appalachian states, we help mobilize volunteers and resources to meet needs. One of the greatest ministry needs in this area occurs around Christmastime. NCBM is calling on churches statewide to respond to this need through Appalachian Christmas Outreach 2021. Our goal is to collect 18,000 backpacks of items to be distributed to Appalachian children in areas of need in late November and December 2021. Statewide collection date will be Saturday, November 6.
