College Ministry Grants

For the past two years, Three Forks Baptist Association has made grants available to our churches who wish to be engaged in missions work on college campuses in the High Country, to include Appalachian State, Lees McRae, and Caldwell Community College.

Applications for grants from the fund may be made from July 1 until August 1 of this year, to the association's Finance Team. Churches may submit an application for only one project in any given year, with the application ranging between \$500 and \$2,000. Notification of awards will be made by August 15 of this year.


High Country Impact is a day when all of the churches of Three Forks Baptist
